For The New England and Connecticut Chapters - The United States Coast Guard Academy Parents Association of New England, hosts of the 2004 All Service Academies Holly Ball, is pleased to announce that this year's Holly Ball will be held at the beautiful Seaport Hotel, One Seaport Lane, Boston, MA on Thursday, December 30, 2004 from 7:00 p.m.-12:00 a.m. Cadets/Midshipmen, from the CGA, West Point, Naval Academy, Air Force Academy, and Merchant Marine Academies, their families and guests from the states of Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island, New Hampshire, Maine and Vermont are invited to attend.
